
The Village Board of the Village of Weyerhaeuser, Rusk County, Wisconsin, does ordain as follows:

CHAPTER 1.

SECTION 1. - AGE LIMIT.

No person under the age of sixteen years, unless accompanied by an adult, and no intoxicated person or person subject to epilepsy shall operate any automobile, motor truck, motor delivery wagon, automobile bus, motorcycle or other similar vehicle on any highway in said village.

SECTION 2. - SPEED LIMIT.

No person shall operate a motor vehicle recklessly or at a rate of speed greater than is reasonable and proper with regard to the width, traffic and use of the highway and the rules of the road, or so as to endanger the property, life or limb of any person, and no person shall operate any such vehicle along any highway in the corporate limits of said village at a rate of speed exceeding fifteen (15) miles per hour; and no person shall operate a motor vehicle through any cemetery or park or in passing any school grounds at a speed exceeding twelve (12) miles per hour. In turning corners and going around curves, at sharp declines, at the intersection of any street or cross road and where the view in the direction in which the vehicle is proceeding shall be obstructed, the driver shall so limit the speed of such vehicle as shall tend to avoid accidents. At the intersection of public highways of said village the driver of any such vehicle shall keep to the right of the center of such intersection of such highway when turning to the right and pass to the right of the center of such intersection when turning to the left.

SECTION 3. - AUTOMOBILE BRAKES, HORNS AND BUELLS

(1). Every automobile, motorcycle, or other motor vehicle, used upon any public highway of said village, shall be provided with sufficient brakes and an adequate bell, horn or other signal device. No person shall use any signal device which shall not produce a abrupt sound sufficiently loud to serve as an adequate warning of danger, and no person operating any motor vehicle or motorcycle shall make or cause to be made any unnecessary noise with any such bell, horn or other signal device, or use the same except as a warning of danger. The use of siren, except upon motor vehicles in charge of the police and fire department of said village and upon hospital ambulances and fire patrols is prohibited.

(2). It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any automobile, motorcycle, or other similar motor vehicle, without a modern and improved muffler or with its muffler open on any street within said village.

SECTION 4. - AUTOMOBILE ROAD RIGHTS.

Every owner and operator of an automobile or other similar motor vehicle shall have equal rights upon all public highways of said village

with all other users of such highways, and no person shall unreasonably obstruct or impede the right of travel of such operator or owner.

SECTION 5. - AUTOMOBILE LIGHTS.

(1). From thirty (30) minutes after sunset until thirty (30) minutes before sunrise, no automobile, motorcycle, or other similar motor vehicle shall be driven upon or occupy any public highway in said village unless such vehicle is provided with sufficient lights, of such design and so adjusted and operated as to render the use of the highway by such vehicles safe for all the public.

(2). The requirements for head lamps on any automobile or other similar motor vehicle, except motorcycles, while being driven upon the highway, shall be such as to enable the driver to clearly distinguish a person, vehicle or other substantial object two hundred (200) feet ahead and the adjustment and operation of such head lamps shall be such as to avoid dangerous glare or dazzle.

SECTION 6. - PENALTY

Any person violating any of the provisions of Sections 1-2-3-4-5- shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and if found guilty there of shall be assessed a fine of not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00* nor more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), and in default of such payment of such fine by imprisonment in the County Jail for not less than Ten (10) days nor more Three (3) months, or both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.
