ORDINANCE NO. 1- 81

"To Provide a Program for Protecting the Public Water System from Contamination Due To Backflow of Contaminants Through the Water Service Connection Into the Public Water System"

"Whereas, Chapters NR111 and H62, Wisconsin Administrative Code require protection of the public water system from contaminants due to the backflow of contaminants through the water service connection; and

"Whereas, The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and Health and Social Services require the maintenance of a continuous program of cross connection control which will systematically and effectively prevent the contamination of all potable water systems; now, therefore, Be It Ordained by the Village Board of the Village of Weyerhaeuser, State of Wisconsin:

Section One. That a cross connection shall be defined as any physical connection or arrangement between two otherwise separate systems ~~which contain potable water~~, one of which contains potable water from the Village of Weyerhaeuser Water System, and the other, water from a private source, water of unknown or questionable safety, or steam, gases, or chemicals, whereby there may be a flow from one system to the other, the direction of flow depending on the pressure differential between the two systems.

Section Two. That no person, firm or corporation shall establish or maintain or permit to be maintained any cross connection. No interconnection shall be established whereby potable water from a private, auxiliary or emergency water supply other than the ~~regular~~ ^{public} water supply of the village of Weyerhaeuser may enter the supply or distribution system of said municipality, unless such private, auxiliary or emergency water supply or the method of connection and use of such supply shall have been approved by the Weyerhaeuser Water Superintendent and by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources in accordance with Section NR 111.25(3), Wisconsin Administrative Code.

Section Three. That it shall be the duty of the water superintendent to cause inspection to be made of all properties served by the public water system where cross connections with the public water system are deemed possible. The frequency of inspections and re-inspections based on potential health hazards involved shall be as established by the Weyerhaeuser Water Department and the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.

Section Four. That upon presentation of credentials, the representative of the Weyerhaeuser Water Department shall have the right to request entry at any reasonable time to examine any property served by a connection to the public water system of the village of Weyerhaeuser, for cross connections. If entry is refused, such representative shall obtain a special inspection warrant under S. 66.122, Wisconsin statutes. On request, the owner, lessee or occupant of any property so served shall furnish to the inspection agency any pertinent information regarding the piping system ~~and~~ systems on such property.

Section five. That the Weyerhaeuser Water Department is hereby authorized and directed to discontinue water service to any property wherein any connection in violation of this ordinance exists, and to take such other precautionary measures deemed necessary to eliminate any danger of contamination of the public water system. Water service shall be discontinued only after reasonable notice and opportunity for hearing under Chapter 68, Wisconsin Statutes, except as provided in Section six. Water service to such property shall not be restored until the cross connection(s) has been eliminated in compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Section six. That if it is determined by the Weyerhaeuser Water Department that a cross connection or emergency endangers public health, safety or welfare and requires immediate action, and a written finding to that effect is filed with the clerk of the village of Weyerhaeuser and delivered to the customers' premises, service may be immediately discontinued. The customer shall have an opportunity for hearing under Ch. 68, Wis. Statutes, within 10 days of such emergency discontinuance.

Section seven. That the village of Weyerhaeuser adopts by reference the State Plumbing Code of Wisconsin being Chapter 62, Wisconsin Administrative Code.

Section eight. That this ordinance does not supercede the State Plumbing Code but is supplementary to it.

Section nine. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the 1st day of June 1981, after due passage and publication.

ORDINANCE NO. 1-80

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR WATER SERVICE RATES FOR THE VILLAGE OF WEYERHAEUSER WATER UTILITY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ORDER OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION OF WISCONSIN, DOCKET 6470-WR-1, DATED April 22, 1980.....

WHEREAS, Under the provisions of Chapter 196 Wisconsin Statutes, the village of Weyerhaeuser, Rusk County, Wisconsin is authorized by Public Service Commission Order in Docket CA-4148, dated January 7, 1963 and amended by supplemental Order dated April 2, 1965 to operate a water public utility, and establish rates in accordance with the rates specified in that order; and

WHEREAS, The village has been operating the utility in accordance with said Order for approximately 16 years until the present time; and

WHEREAS, The village found it necessary to request the Public Service Commission for authority to increase rates due to greatly increased costs of providing such services; and

WHEREAS, The Public Service Commission in its Order dated April 22, 1980 in Docket 6470-WR-1 authorized the village to place in effect new rates and rules as specified in Appendix B of said Order;

NOW THEREFORE, The Village Board of the Village of Weyerhaeuser, Rusk County, Wisconsin, do ordain that:

1. Ordinance 1-65 adopted April 3, 1965 establishing rates and rules for the Weyerhaeuser Water Utility be and is hereby repealed and superseded by this Ordinance 1-80.
2. The village board place in effect the rates and rules specified in the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin Order dated April 22, 1980 in Docket 6470-WR-1 which are incorporated in appendix B of said Order and made part of this Ordinance by reference.
3. That the effective date of the Ordinance shall be July 1, 1980 after due passage and publication.
