Portrait Submission Info for Mural Projects

Overview: The following information is designed to help collect useable material for mural projects that feature the sponsorship of portraits of specific people. **Remember, I am only as good as the photos you send me.** Please read carefully as this will help us work together to create a wonderful piece.

Requirements:

- DO NOT SEND ORIGINAL PHOTOS!!! Please send good quality color copies, or scan photos and print them out <u>full page size</u>. (<u>If necessary</u>, you can email scanned photos directly to Kelly Meredith at <u>fanfish@plbb.us</u>, but <u>please wait until you are asked to do so</u>.) Copies will not be returned.
- 2. <u>I need a good quality portrait shot:</u> wedding photos, yearbook photos, <u>service photos</u>, or any professional shots will work best and are preferred. I can accept amateur photos if they meet the other requirements.
- 3. Portrait shots need to be at least half a page in size. Full body shots need to be a full page.
- 4. Portrait shots need to be well lit showing the facial features clearly.
- 5. Portrait shots need to be close up and closely cropped.
- **6.** Please feel free to submit many photos to help illustrate the character of the person being depicted. I will choose the photo that works the best for the overall project.
- **7.** You do not need to submit a full body photo; just indicate on the form the height, weight, time period and clothing you would like the person to be wearing. I can find my own models. However, full body shots are very helpful. They don't need to be a clear as the portrait shot.
- **8.** Please make sure you have an email contact. If you send poor photos, I contact you via email to ask for better material.

Things to Avoid for Portrait shots:

- 1. **Flashlit photos-** photos taken indoors with a flash. These are too 'flat' and have no shadows and are often blurry
- 2. **Any photo where the face is overexposed** I would actually prefer photos with strong shadows.
- 3. Distant, grainy photos

Please do not send photos of the individual as part of a large group shot, especially in an informal setting. These are too small and too grainy.
